

The details on each offering are as follows:

<p><i>Geopolitics and You</i> 19 October 1000-1100 EST</p>	<p>This course will focus on the current geopolitical situation and how politics, economics, climate change, and other topics that impact the NDS, NMS, and future operations for the USAF. Focus will be made to help officers understand how these various topics affect them personally and what to look for to better predict their futures. Presented by Mr. Mark Foulon from the Eisenhower School for National Security and Resource Strategy, this course will link us to the big picture in a new and exciting way.</p>
<p><i>Sortie Production and Management Primer</i> 20 October 1000-1100 EST</p>	<p>This course will be part one of an in-person course at the Spring 2021 Sortie Production and Management class offering. Taught by the AMMOS/ASPC cadre, it will prepare students for in-depth discussion of sortie generation principles and introduce basic concepts and information to help logisticians boost readiness and support to flying operations.</p>
<p><i>Logistics and the Internet of Things (IoT)</i> 21 October 1000-1100 EST</p>	<p>This course will explore how to improve logistics systems and consolidate legacy systems for logistics professionals. It will educate those who participate on how to influence software and link supply systems to maintenance systems and the importance of the operational base in the development and sustainment of logistics systems. Led by Mr. Michael Jennings, this course will spark next generation thinking.</p>
<p><i>Logistics Special Developmental Programs</i> 22 October 1000-1100 EST</p>	<p>This course will be a quick and dirty dive into the various logistics special programs available to the logistics community. It will not be the standard AFPC briefing—graduates of LCBP, EWI, and other critical programs target building special skills that are integral to the future of logistics and what being selected means.</p>
<p><i>Leading and Crisis Management</i> 23 October 1000-1100 EST</p>	<p>This presentation will be a panel-style briefing by key leaders that covers what it is like to continue operations, manage personnel, and thrive in a crisis environment. Led by Brig Gen David Sanford and Brig. Gen. C. McCauley von Hoffman, this course will facilitate learning and provide valuable perspective for young officers so that they can more adeptly adapt and overcome challenges as they progress through their own careers.</p>
